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#### Verification of 2022 Student Income Information

**STUDENT TAX FILERS:** The Instructions below apply to the student and spouse (if married). Notify the financial aid office if the student or spouse filed separate IRS income tax returns for 2022 or has a change in marital status after December 31, 2022.

**Instructions**: Complete this section if you, or your spouse, <u>filed or will file</u> a 2022 IRS income tax return(s). As part of federal student aid eligibility, students, as spouses (as appropriate), will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. If you and your spouse filed separate returns, you both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2022 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using income and tax information directly from the IRS.

- Get Transcript Online Go to <a href="www.irs.gov">www.irs.gov</a>, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript Online." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and *NOT* the "Account Transcript." To use the Get Transcript Online tool, the user must have 1) access to a valid email address, 2) a text-enabled mobile phone (pay-as-you-go plans cannot be used) in the user's name, and 3) specific financial account numbers (such as credit card number or an account number for a home mortgage or auto loan). The transcript displays online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.

- Paper Request Form IRS Form 4506T-EZ or IRS Form 4506-T.

Tax return transcripts are generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the request.
