I grant this permission with the understanding that Centralia College:

- Operates as an institution of higher education and, consequently, maintains an adult learning environment.
- Does not require instructors to monitor student attendance.
- Does not automatically grant parental access to a student's educational records under federal regulations.
- Does not provide specialized supervision or guardianship for enrolled students.
- Serves a diverse student population encompassing various age groups, cultures, backgrounds, and life experiences, including individuals who may have criminal records, whether known or unknown to college staff.
- Exposes students to a broad range of ideas, philosophies, concepts, and materials, some of which may be considered unsuitable for younger students.
- Holds all students to uniform academic and disciplinary standards, regardless of age.
- Does not provide special allowances or accommodations based on a student's age.
- May expect students to engage in classroom discussions and collaborate with peers of various ages.
- Does not offer financial aid to students admitted under this exception.
- May require additional permissions for participation in field trips, off-campus activities, or related events.

Parents or legal guardians of students under the age of 16 enrolled in Continuing Education courses must register for the course alongside the student and accompany them to each class session.
