DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Thank you for joining us today! This performance marks the seventh annual Summer Theatre Workshop at Centralia College. Each year, middle and high school students, over the course of three weeks, write, compose, design, and perform an original piece of theatre with music. We start week one by identifying the themes they want to explore, the genre and time period. The group then splits up into their areas of interest. The writing/composing group works on the script and songs, the design group determines how to best use space and costume the actors, while the acting group hones their craft by working on monologues and scenes. At the end of the first week, we have a rough draft of the play and songs. By the start of week two, we have a finished script, cast the play, start rehearsing, and building the set. Week three is dedicated to rehearsal and tech. The performance you will see today is the end result of that process and involved an immense amount of work in a short period of time.

Each year, the group has produced a unique piece of theatre. The first year, in 2018, the workshop presented a piece on bullying entitled *Hurt People Hurt People*. In 2019, *Out of The Blue* addressed mental illness and social pressures to be "normal." *If The Crown Fits* in 2021 was a medieval tale of found family and fairness. *Forevermore* was a pirate allegory in 2022, *The Rest is Silence* was a murder mystery play within a play in 2023, and last year's *All That You Hold Dear* portrayed how the death of a sibling brought a feuding family together.

It has been a joy to work with such a talented, lively, and dedicated group this year, many of whom returned from last year and the years before, some for the fourth or fifth time. Theatre is the space that many of us consider our second home and those we work with our found families. Our theatre family this year outdid themselves with a tighter script, more original songs, and an outstanding concept and message. I hope you enjoy this performance of *A Night to Remember*... *I Think*.
